Dorothy Mae Brown was born November 9, 1920 (30 minutes before her fraternal twin sister Eula Mae) to Madison Brown and Odessa Rosemond in Wetumka, Okla. The family moved to Oklahoma City when the girls were young, Dorothy attended public schools and graduated from Douglass High School.

Dorothy was married to Charles Pollard, Sr., and later after moving to Alaska to Carl Larkin. Dorothy worked for years as a catereress helping to plan events and celebrations for many of the areas famous and prominent families. Of all the jobs she had, however, her most fulfilling was as housekeeper for one family for nearly 3 decades. One who loved children, this provided her with an opportunity to contribute to the upbringing and socialization of the family's daughters and later their children.

She came to Christ at a young age and remained a faithful and dedicated member of Faith Memorial, for many years. Some of her fondest memories were of the strong and enduring friendships she developed and maintained with her fellow choir members. Dorothy was a fun loving, and outspoken woman who never met a stranger. She loved people and they loved her back. Ever the jokester she would often play practical jokes and was a great teller of "tall tales" which never failed to bring a smile to people's faces. In fact the day before she passed she was teaching other seniors how to dance.

Known as one of the "Brown" girls, she was preceded in death by her sisters Eula, Julia and Sophie as well as her parents. She is survived by her nieces Julia Brown of New Mexico and Renee Jones of Las Vegas, NV and her grandniece Lamonee Patterson also of Las Vegas, NV. Dorothy is also survived by a host of cousins including but not limited to Barbara J.
